Summary of proposal:	Continued funding for youth mental health services
Issue the proposal will address:	Continuing funding for youth mental health services will support the work of building a better integrated youth mental health system and gives certainty to community sector providers delivering these programs.

### What are the key assumptions that have been made in the proposal?

This proposal continues funding for youth mental health programs being delivered in the ACT that are supporting young people to access a range of mental health services and supports to navigate the mental health system.

#### Continuing grants for the WOKE and Stepping Stones programs

The University of Canberra WOKE Youth Dialectical Behaviour Therapy (DBT) program contract is assumed to be \$304,000 in 2024-25. It is assumed that the program in its current state will continue to be funded (indexed at 2.5%) will be applied to program costs in the forward estimates. This will be funded for a further 4 years from 2025-26 to 2028-29. This will support a free of charge DBT program for young people aged between 15 to 21 in the ACT.

The Marymead CatholicCare Stepping Stones multidisciplinary child trauma service program contract is assumed to be \$445,000 in 2024-25. It is assumed that the program in its current state will continue to be funded and 2.5% indexation will be applied to program costs in the forward estimates.

This will be funded for a further 4 years from 2025-26 to 2028-29. This will support the well established program to provide child trauma services to young people in the ACT.

For 5-17 year olds the leading cause of death in Australia is suicide. The impacts of mental illness in young people can be long lasting without appropriate treatment and services available to assist that young person as early as possible. The Missing Middle report highlighted the current issues in relation to the ACT's youth mental health services and the needs of the community.
