ACT services trade deficit narrows in 2022-23.

ACT

The ACT's services exports increased by 53.7 per cent driven by a recovery in education exports (85.5 per cent) and inbound tourism (488.9 per cent) following the COVID-19 pandemic.

The ACT's services imports increased by 27.9 per cent driven by a recovery in outbound tourism (285.7 per cent) and an increase in government goods and services (6.4 per cent).

The ACT services trade deficit was \$634 million, narrowing from a deficit of \$765 million in 2021-22.

National

Australia's services exports increased by 56.1 per cent in 2022-23 as travel services recovered from the pandemic lows of 2021-22. The recovery in services exports was driven by education-related travel as overseas students shifted to on-shore study from off-shore correspondence course delivery following the relaxation of pandemic travel restrictions. All states experienced a strong recovery in services exports in 2022-23 driven by education and inbound tourism.

Australia's services imports increased by 49.9 per cent driven by outbound tourism and passenger transport. Services imports was at its highest level since the series began in 1998-99. All states and territories recorded rises in total services imports driven by travel services and passenger transport services.

Australia's services trade deficit increased to \$11.9 billion in 2022-23 from \$10.5 billion in 2021-22.






Services exports index (nominal), ACT and Australia

Services imports index (nominal), ACT and Australia




